Engaging activities... To keep your kids learning and having fun this summer

Word Hunt: Create a word list. Write each word on a sticky note and hide them around the house. Each time your child finds a word have them read the word to you. Advance-have them create a sentence when they find the word.

Outdoor Memory: Write math facts or words on paper plates. Place them in your yard face down. Have your child flip a plate and try to find it's match.

Decode the Secret Message: Create a secret message. Use math facts that correspond with the letter of the message. Example Secret Message: *Summer Fun*. Math fact 3x4. 12 = S

Math Fact Card Game: Using a deck of cards flip two cards over. For example, $3 \notin 5$ would be 3×5 . The first player to say the answer gets both cards. The player with the most cards when the deck is finished is the winner.

Secret Word Jar: Fill a jar with different words. Have your child pick a word each day and keep it a secret. Then challenge your child to use it in conversations throughout their day. See if they can get someone to guess when they use the word.

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
